UNC-Florida Series: UNC leads, 3-2

Last Meeting: Florida 71, UNC 59 on April 3, 2000, in the NCAA Final Four in Indianapolis

AT A GLANCE

◆ North Carolina (4-1) will try to defeat its second ranked opponent in two days when it faces Florida (3-2) in the fifth-place game of the Battle 4 Atlantis at the Imperial Arena on Paradise Island on Friday. Tipoff is slated for just after 8 p.m.

◆ Florida is No. 18 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches poll and advanced to Friday's game with a 56-47 win over UAB. Earlier on Thursday, the Tar Heels beat No. 22/23 UCLA, 78-56.

◆ Friday's game will be televised by AXS TV, with Kenny Rice, Seth Davis and Tom Walsh on the call. AXS TV is available in the Chapel Hill, Raleigh, Durham and Fayetteville, N.C., areas on the following channels: AT&T U-verse (Channel 1106), CenturyLink Prism (Ch. 1105), Charter (Ch. 857), Comporium Communications (Ch. 1136), DirecTV (Ch. 340), DISH (Ch. 167), Morris Broadband (Ch. 812), Suddenlink (Ch. 203) and Windstream (Ch. 570).

◆ The Tar Heel travel party will return to Chapel Hill on Saturday afternoon to begin preparation for next Wednesday's ACC/Big Ten Challenge game against Iowa in the Smith Center.

A CAROLINA WIN WOULD...

◆ Improve Carolina to 5-1 this season...Mark the Tar Heels' second win over a ranked team in two days in the Bahamas after losing to unranked Butler on Wednesday...Give UNC fifth place in the 2014 Battle 4 Atlantis...Give Williams his 1,004th combined win as a college coach (head and assistant).

A CAROLINA LOSS WOULD...

◆ Drop the Tar Heels to 4-2 in 2014-15...Drop UNC to 1-2 this week in the Bahamas.

TAR HEEL TRENDS

◆ North Carolina is in its 105th season as a varsity basketball program and is third in NCAA history in wins with 2,118.

◆ Thursday marked **Roy Williams'** 400th game as head coach at Carolina. The Tar Heels are 310-90 (.775) with three Final Four appearances & two national championships in 12 seasons under Williams.

◆ Through the first five games of 2014-15, **Marcus Paige** is 14 for 34 from three-point range (.412 to lead the team). At the same time, he's shooting 9 for 27 from two-point range (.333).

◆ **Nate Britt** is 4 for 11 from three-point range so far this season. Britt was 3 for 12 from long range as a freshman last season.

◆ **Kennedy Meeks** had five double-digit rebounding games as a freshman in 2013-14 but has three already this season.

◆ Freshman **Justin Jackson** has started every game this season and is fourth on the team at 11.6 points per contest while shooting 23 for 44 from the field (.523). He has 12 assists and five turnovers through five games.

◆ **Paige** enters Friday's game with 957 career points, needing 43 to be the 71st Tar Heel to score 1,000 (most in NCAA history).

◆ **Paige** has hit at least one three-point field goal in 18 consecutive games. He has scored in double figures in eight of the last nine contests.

◆ Sophomore forward **Isaiah Hicks** is coming into his own as Carolina's top big man off the bench this season. After playing out of position on the wing in 2013-14, he's moved back inside this year and responded well. He made his first career start against UCLA and scored a career-high 10 points for the second game in a row. He also scored a career-high 10 points with five rebounds and two blocks in 17 minutes in the

loss to Butler. Four days earlier, Hicks scored a then career-high nine points at Davidson.

◆ Hicks scored 42 points all of last season but has 43 points through six games this year (8.6 per game).

◆ UNC has scored 100 or more points 48 times in Williams' 12 seasons as head coach. The Tar Heels are 47-1 in those games.

◆ Carolina has won each of its last six overtime games and nine of its last 11. The Tar Heels are 59-51 overall in overtime games, including 9-7 under **Roy Williams**.

◆ **Roy Williams** has 144 career wins in ACC regular season and ACC Tournament games, ranking sixth in conference history (Bobby Cremins of Georgia Tech is fifth with 149). Williams' 306 overall wins as an ACC coach are seventh in league history (Terry Holland of Virginia is sixth with 326).

◆ Williams' ACC road game winning percentage is second-best in conference history at .644 (58-32 road record).

PREVIEWING FLORIDA

◆ Florida enters Friday's game with a record of 3-2 after its 56-47 win over UAB on Thursday. The Gators went 36-3 and reached the NCAA Final Four before losing to eventual national champ Connecticut in the semifinals.

◆ The Gators return one starter from their 2013-14 squad that won a program-record 30 consecutive games for head coach Billy Donovan.

THE SERIES VS. FLORIDA

◆ Carolina leads the all-time series with Florida, 3-2, but the teams have met just once since 1965.

◆ That most recent meeting was a 71-59 Gator win in the 2000 NCAA semifinals in Indianapolis. That loss ended Carolina's Cinderella run to the Final Four as a No. 8 seed and was the final game of **Bill Guthridge's** tenure as the Tar Heel head coach. He retired three months later. **Matt Doherty** replaced Guthridge from 2000-03, and **Roy Williams** took over in Chapel Hill in April of 2003.

◆ Carolina beat the Gators in Dec. 1965 in Charlotte and in 1923 and 1926 in Chapel Hill. Florida beat UNC in Gainesville in Dec. 1964.

◆ **Roy Williams** is 2-1 as a head coach against Florida (all at Kansas).

TAR HEELS PULL AWAY FROM BRUINS, 78-56

◆ North Carolina rebounded from its first loss of 2014-15 with a 78-56 win over No. 22 UCLA on Thursday in the Battle 4 Atlantis.

◆ The Tar Heels closed the first half on a 32-11 run to take a 14-point lead at the break after trailing 18-11 early, then went on a 15-0 run after the Bruins had cut it to 47-38 with just over 16 minutes left in the game.

◆ Carolina forced a season-high 23 turnovers and held a 31-6 advantage in points off turnovers. UCLA, which entered the contest ranked third in the nation in assist/turnover ra-

tio, had just seven assists against its 23 miscues.

◆ UCLA entered the game shooting over 39 percent from three-point range as a team but went 1 for 14 from long range against UNC. Bruin starting guards Norman Powell, Isaac Hamilton and Bryce Alford combined to shoot 7 for 25 (.280) with five assists and 18 turnovers.

◆ The Tar Heels limited UCLA to nine offensive rebounds after giving up 29 offensive boards in Wednesday's loss to Butler. The Bruins did out-rebound UNC 38-35 overall, partly because UNC took 23 more shots than did the Bruins.

◆ Carolina attempted 67 shots in the game (hitting 28 for 41.8 percent). UCLA attempted 44 shots and made 17 (.386).

◆ The Bruins entered the game hitting 39 percent of their three-point attempts in 2014-15. The Tar Heel defense limited UCLA to 1 for 14 from three-point range.

◆ The 22-point win marks Carolina's biggest win over a ranked opponent since beating No. 13 Michigan State, 98-63, on Dec. 3, 2008, in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Detroit.

◆ **Isaiah Hicks** made his first career start and scored a career-high 10 points for the second consecutive game. He has already exceeded his scoring total from all of last season (43 points this year vs. 42 all of last year).

◆ Carolina started **Paige**, **Jackson**, **Hicks**, **Nate Britt** and **Joel James** in the game.

PAIGE ON OSCAR ROBERTSON WATCH LIST

◆ Junior point guard **Marcus Paige** headlined the 24-player watch list for the 2015 US-BWA Oscar Robertson Trophy, given to the National Player the Year.

SEYMORE WINS MITCHELL SCHOLARSHIP

◆ Senior **Sasha Seymore** has been named a recipient of the George J. Mitchell Scholarship, which supports graduate studies in Ireland and Northern Ireland.

◆ The Mitchell Scholarship Program, named to honor former US Senator George Mitchell's pivotal contribution to the Northern Ireland peace process, is designed to introduce and connect generations of future American lead-

◆ Seymore and fellow UNC winner Thomas Golden were two of 12 Americans selected on Nov. 22 for the award, which provides tuition, accommodations, a living expenses stipend and an international travel stipend for one year.

◆ Seymore played two years of junior varsity basketball at Carolina and earned a spot on the varsity squad last month. He is from New Bern, N.C., and is a 2011 graduate of New Bern High School. He plans to graduate with a dou-

ble-major in economics and global studies in the College of Arts and Sciences and a minor in business administration this May.

◆ At UNC, Seymore serves as the class president for the UNC Class of 2015 and is the head of all student trip leaders for Kenan-Flagler Business School's global immersions.

◆ Seymore earned the Turner Young Scholarship and the Dixon Scholarship while at UNC. He was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa as a junior and is a member of Honors Carolina.

◆ Seymore is a gifted athlete who gave up offers to play collegiate soccer to instead receive the Morehead-Cain Scholarship, a full, four-year scholarship to UNC that also funds four summer enrichment experiences and additional educational opportunities. Seymore uses his passion for sports to promote public service in the world, a goal he will use his Mitchell Scholarship to study the possibilities of peace through sports at the University of Queens in Belfast, Northern Ireland.

◆ "Sasha Seymore is a remarkable young man," said Mary Floyd-Wilson, director of Carolina's Office of Distinguished Scholarships. "He embodies the ideal qualities of a scholar-athlete. Not only is he passionately committed to furthering peace-building through sports, but he is also an inspirational leader who derives joy from the hard work he puts into athletics, academics, and volunteering. His uncanny ability to bring diverse people together will translate beautifully to his future work in conflict resolution."

TAR HEELS WIN FIRST ROAD GAME OF 2014-15 AT DAVIDSON

◆ Carolina won 90-72 over Davidson in Charlotte on Saturday Nov. 22, marking the Tar Heels' first road victory of the season.

◆ Carolina limited the Wildcats to 33.8 percent shooting from the floor and held a 44-22 advantage in points in the paint while out-rebounding Davidson, 51-42.

◆ Charlotte native **Kennedy Meeks** led the Tar Heels with 19 points and 12 rebounds in front of a hometown crowd and over a dozen family members. He posted his second consecutive double-double after tallying 21 points and 12 boards in the Nov. 16 win over Robert Morris.

◆ Freshman **Justin Jackson** scored 18 points with four assists, one turnover and three rebounds.

◆ **Marcus Paige** hit 3 of 6 three-pointers and finished with 13 points and four assists without a turnover.

◆ **J.P. Tokoto** tallied 10 points, seven rebounds, four assists and one turnover.

◆ **Isaiah Hicks** scored a career-high nine points off the bench, hitting 3 of 5 shots and grabbing four rebounds.

◆ Junior **Brice Johnson** scored nine first-half points but didn't score after halftime and fouled out with 4:43 remaining.

◆ Carolina attempted 28 free throws to Davidson's 13 and held advantages in points off turnovers (10-5), second-chance points (24-15), fast break points (10-5) and bench points (21-14).

◆ Davidson's Brian Sullivan hit seven three-pointers and scored 33 points in last season's meeting with the Wildcats but finished with four points on 2 of 10 shooting (including 0 for 8 from three-point range) this time.

◆ The Wildcats entered the game hitting 50 percent of their three-point attempts as a team but struggled against the UNC defense, finishing 11 for 36 from long range.

◆ Carolina committed just nine turnovers as a team after making only eight miscues against Robert Morris in its previous outing.

IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

◆ Carolina is ranked No. 5 in both the Associated Press poll and No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls this week (as of Nov. 24). UCLA is No. 22 in the AP poll and No. 23 in the coaches poll.

◆ The Tar Heels began the year ranked No. 6 in both national preseason polls.

PAIGE ON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

◆ Junior point guard **Marcus Paige** is among 50 players on the preseason top 50 for the Wooden Award, given annually to the national player of the year.

◆ Paige, a preseason first-team All-America and the preseason ACC Player of the Year, is among eight ACC players on the list. He is

JACKSON & PINSON START FIRST GAME AS FRESHMEN

◆ Freshmen **Justin Jackson** and **Theo Pinson** were in the starting lineup for the Nov. 14 season opener against NC Central.

◆ Jackson and Pinson are the 31st and 32nd UNC players to start their first college game as freshmen since the NCAA restored freshman eligibility for the 1972-73 season (joining teammates **Marcus Paige** and **Nate Britt** on the list).

◆ Jackson and Pinson are the 11th and 12th freshmen to start their first game at Carolina under **Roy Williams**.

A LOOK AHEAD TO A TOUGH EARLY STRETCH OF THE SCHEDULE ...

◆ After two home games in three days on opening weekend, Carolina is in a stretch of four games in a row and seven of nine away from Chapel Hill.

◆ The week after Thanksgiving, the Tar Heels will host back-to-back home games against Iowa in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Dec. 3 and East Carolina on Dec. 7.

◆ Then it's back on the road for three consecutive dates away from home at Kentucky (Dec. 13), at UNCG (Dec. 16) and in Chicago

◆ Carolina held NCCU to 32.1 percent shooting in the game, including 25.9 percent in the first half.

◆ Carolina out-rebounded the Eagles 29-13

as it slowly increased its lead in the second half.

◆ Carolina improved to 98-7 all-time in home openers and has won 82 of its last 84 (and 13 in a row).

◆ UNC is 93-12 in season openers with wins in 80 of its last 85 (and 10 in a row).

◆ The win moves **Roy Williams** into 19th place all-time in wins, breaking a deadlock with DePaul's Ray Meyer. Jerry Tarkanian and Norm Stewart are tied for 17th with 729.

◆ **Justin Jackson** and **Theo Pinson** both started the game, making them the 31st and 32nd Tar Heels to start their collegiate debuts as freshmen. They are the 11th and 12th to do so under Williams.

◆ **Brice Johnson** led the Tar Heels in scoring with 12 points and added eight rebounds and two blocks. The 12 points match the fewest points by UNC's leading scorer in any game last year (12 by **James Michael McAdoo** against Miami).

◆ **Kennedy Meeks** (10) and **J.P. Tokoto** (10) also scored in double figures for UNC. Jackson added nine and **Marcus Paige** and **Isaiah Hicks** each scored eight (a career high for Hicks).

◆ Junior forward **Joel James** scored seven points, all in the second half. The seven points are more than he scored in any game last year and are his highest output since he had eight at NC State midway through his freshman season.

ROY WILLIAMS GETS 1,000TH WIN

AS A COLLEGE HEAD & ASSISTANT COACH

◆ North Carolina head coach **Roy Williams** won his 1,000th career game as a college head and assistant coach on Nov. 14 against North Carolina Central.

◆ Williams, in his 37th season of college coaching, has a combined record of 1,003-256. That includes a 728-191 mark as a head coach and 275-65 in 10 seasons as an assistant to **Dean Smith** at Carolina from 1979-88.

◆ Williams ranks 19th in NCAA history in wins. Jerry Tarkanian and Norm Stewart are tied for 17th with 729.

PAIGE A PRESEASON AP ALL-AMERICA

◆ **Marcus Paige** is the sixth North Carolina player to earn preseason All-America honors from the Associated Press, earning the honor with the release of the 2014-15 AP Preseason All-America Team.

◆ The rest of the team includes Wisconsin center forward Frank Kaminsky, Louisville forward Montrezl Harrell, Wichita State junior guard Fred VanVleet and Duke center Jhalil Okafor.

◆ Paige was the leading vote-getter, named on 58 ballots by the 65-member national media panel.

◆ Since 1995-96, when the AP started its preseason squad, six Carolina players have earned AP preseason All-America nine times. Tyler Hansbrough was a three-time honoree and Harrison Barnes picked up the honors twice.

◆ Paige also earned preseason first-team

All-America honors from USA Today, Sports Illustrated, the Sporting News, Athlon and the Blue Ribbon Yearbook.

◆ ESPN.com named Paige the No. 2 player in the nation for the 2014-15 season, trailing only Wisconsin forward Frank Kaminsky. Several media outlets have tabbed Paige the nation's best point guard.

PAIGE PRESEASON ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

◆ **Marcus Paige** was named the 2014-15 Preseason ACC Player of the Year in late October by media voters at ACC Operation Basketball, the conference's annual preseason media day. Paige also grabbed the most votes on the preseason All-ACC team.

◆ Joining Paige on the preseason All-ACC squad were Montrezl Harrell (Louisville), Jahlil Okafor (Duke), Malcolm Brogdon (Virginia) and Jerian Grant (Notre Dame).

PAIGE ON COUSY WATCH LIST

◆ **Marcus Paige**, one of five finalists for the 2014 Bob Cousy Award, is on the watch list for the award once again this season.

◆ Paige is among 36 players on the watch list for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer Bob Cousy and presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, recognizes the top point guard in the nation.

◆ The watch list will be narrowed down to a final 20 in early February, then a final five by early March. A selection committee appointed by the Hall of Fame to review the candidates in contention for the nation's top collegiate point-guard members of the media, head coaches, media relations contacts and Hall of Famers.

◆ Carolina is the only school in the nation with three Cousy Award winners in **Raymond Felton** (2005), **Ty Lawson** (2009) and **Kendall Marshall** (2012).

◆ Previous winners of the Cousy Award include Jameer Nelson (St. Joseph's), Felton, Dee Brown (Illinois), Acie Law (Texas A&M), DJ Augustin (Texas), Lawson, Greivis Vasquez (Maryland), Kemba Walker (Connecticut), Marshall, Trey Burke (Michigan) and last year's winner Shabazz Napier (Connecticut).

NATION'S BEST BACKCOURT?

◆ CBSsports.com named Carolina's backcourt the best in the nation in the 2014-15 preseason (based on expected production this season from both starters and reserves).

◆ CBS's Matt Norlander wrote of top UNC guards **Marcus Paige**, **Nate Britt**, **Joel Berry II** and **Justin Jackson**:

"Paige is a savant at the point, carrying on a Carolina legacy of super-talented and heady floor generals. He's a different breed from some of the muscular bulldogs in the past decade to wear UNC blue, but Paige's angular approach is unlike any current 1 in the game. Britt is a 5-foot-11 defensive pest. Justin Jackson, who cracked our top-100-players list, could become

a star by February. ... And Joel Berry is a McDonald's All-American point guard who gets to backup Paige. The drop-off won't be significant. In terms of talent, minutes, points, assists and steals, I've got to have the Heels at the top. Paige might win Player of the Year, after all." (Oct. 31)

◆ Later in the preseason, ESPN ranked Paige the nation's second-best player behind Wisconsin forward Frank Kaminsky.

TOUGH BREAK FOR LUKE DAVIS

◆ UNC doctors diagnosed senior guard Luke Davis with a stress fracture in his right foot on Oct. 24. Davis had surgery the following week. Doctors expect Davis to miss two to three months of action.

COLEMAN & SEYMORE ADDED TO ROSTER

◆ The Tar Heels added two walk-on members to the 2014-15 Tar Heel roster in senior **Sasha Seymore** and junior **Justin Coleman** just prior to season.

◆ Seymore is attending UNC on a Morehead-Cain Scholarship, the most prestigious academic grant awarded at Carolina. A forward, he led the JV team in scoring and rebounding as a sophomore. He is the 2014-15 UNC senior class president.

◆ Coleman is a Raleigh native who played at Broughton High School and played the last two years as a guard on the JV team under coaches **Hubert Davis** and **C.B. McGrath**.
