Carolina Faces Oklahoma State in Semifinals

- Carolina defeated Chaminade, 104-63, in the quarterfinals and will face Oklahoma State in Tuesday's semifinal at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
- This is just the second meeting between the Tar Heels and OSU.
- Oklahoma A&M defeated UNC, 46-43, on March 26, 1946, in the original Madison Square Garden in the NCAA championship game.
- It was Carolina's fifth NCAA Tournament game in school history (has played in 157 NCAA Tournament games since).
- John "Hook" Dillon, whose No. 13 is in the rafters of the Smith Center, led the Tar Heels with 16 points.
- Roy Williams is 20-8 against Oklahoma State (all while the head coach at Kansas).

UNC in Maui

- Carolina is 16-3 in seven Maui Invitational appearances.
- The Lahaina Civic Center is 19th in Carolina history in most wins (16) by the Tar Heels in any arena.
- A win over Oklahoma State or on Wednesday would be UNC's 17th in the Lahaina Civic Center, which would tie the RBC Center in Raleigh, N.C., and the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem, N.C., for 17th place.

RANDOM FACT #1

Carolina is ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press and ESPN/Coaches polls. This is the 41st time in the last 62 seasons Carolina has been ranked in the top four in the nation in the AP poll (at some point in the season).

RANDOM FACT #2

Isaiah Hicks has played in 117 games as a Tar Heel and Kennedy Meeks has played in 109. The Chaminade game was the first time they both scored 20 points in a game. Hicks had a game-high 22; Meeks had 20 and a game-high 20 rebounds.

RANDOM FACT #3

Four Tar Heels are averaging between 15.0 and 14.2 points per game (Isaiah Hicks 15.0, Joel Berry II 14.8, Justin Jackson 14.8 and Kennedy Meeks 14.2). Carolina has never finished a season with its top four scorers so tightly bunched. The last time its top four scorers were less than one point apart was 1937-38 when the top four scorers ranged from 7.2 to 6.3 points per game.

Roy Williams in Maui

- This is the sixth time Roy Williams has brought a team to the Maui Invitational.
- Williams' teams have a 14-2 record and have won three championships in Maui.
- Williams is one of three coaches to win the Maui Invitational at least three times (Mike Krzyzewski - 5, Williams - 3, Jim Boeheim - 3).

- At Kansas, he led the Jayhawks to the title in 1996-97 with wins over LSU, California and Virginia. In 2001-02, the Jayhawks lost in the first round to Ball State before beating Houston and Seton Hall.
- His UNC teams are 9-1 in Maui, winning the title in 2004-05 and 2008-09.

UNC All-Time in Hawai'i

- The Tar Heels are 32-5 in the state of Hawai'i – 16-2 in Honolulu and 16-3 in Lahaina.

Tar Heel Notes

- Carolina is 5-0 for the first time since 2011-12. The last time UNC was 6-0 was 2008-09 when the Tar Heels won their first 13 games.
- Carolina has scored 83 or more points in all five games. That's the first time UNC has scored 80 or more in the first five games to start a season since accomplishing that in the first five games in Roy Williams' first year as head coach in 2003-04.
- Carolina has not scored 80 or more points in its first six games to start a season since it did that in the first 12 games in 1993-94.
- Four Tar Heels are averaging between 15.0 and 14.2 points per game (Isaiah Hicks 15.0, Joel Berry II 14.8, Justin Jackson 14.8 and Kennedy Meeks 14.2). Carolina has never finished a season with its top four scorers so tightly bunched. The last time its top four scorers were less than one point apart was 1937-38 when the top four scorers ranged from 7.2 to 6.3 points per game.
- Isaiah Hicks led Carolina in scoring in the last two games at Hawai'i (16) and vs. Chaminade (22). Hicks led the Tar Heels in scoring twice in his first 115 games and twice in his last two.
- Carolina is shooting 51.2 percent from the floor and holding the opponents to 37.0 percent. The Tar Heels have not shot 50 percent from the floor since 1997-98.
- Freshman Tony Bradley is shooting a team-high 67.7 percent from the floor and senior Isaiah Hicks is next at 67.4 percent. Senior Kennedy Meeks is third at 51.7 percent. Brice Johnson (.511 in 2012-13) is the last freshman to lead UNC in field goal percentage.
- Bradley, Hicks and Meeks are a combined 82 for 135 from the floor (.607).
- Carolina has 90 offensive rebounds and the opponents have 92 defensive rebounds.
- Kennedy Meeks (24) and Tony Bradley (24) have combined for 48 offensive rebounds.
- Sophomore guard Kenny Williams is third with 11 offensive rebounds.
- The Tar Heels have 106 assists on 169 field goals (63 percent).
- Six different Tar Heels have led Carolina in assists in the first five games: Nate Britt with 5 vs. Tulane; Joel Berry II, Justin Jackson and Kenny Williams with 5 vs. Chattanooga; Seventh Woods with 6 vs. Long Beach State; Berry with 6 at Hawai'i; and Berry and Brandon Robinson with 4 vs. Chaminade.
- Two Tar Heels have scored in double figures in every game (Justin Jackson and Tony Bradley).
- Carolina has made 98 free throws and the

opponents have attempted 72.

- Tony Bradley leads the team in free throw attempts with 25. No freshman has led the team in free throw attempts since Tyler Hansbrough in 2005-06.
- Carolina is shooting 39.6 percent from three-point range (36 for 91). Last year, UNC set a school record for the lowest three-point percentage (.327).
- Ten Tar Heel are averaging double-figures in minutes led by Justin Jackson at 29.0 per game.
- Thirty-six percent of the opponent's baskets have been three-point field goals. UNC has made 21 percent of its field goals from behind the arc.

Tar Heels Rout Chaminade in Maui Opener

- Carolina scored a season-high 104 points. It's the most points since UNC scored 106 at Florida State on 1/4/16.
- Carolina is 51-1 under head coach Roy Williams when it scores 100 points.
- Carolina has won 50 consecutive times when scoring 100 or more points.
- The win over Chaminade was the first time in four seasons that Isaiah Hicks (22) and Kennedy Meeks (20) each scored 20 points in a game.
- Hicks set a career scoring high with 22. He had 21 as a sophomore at Boston College and 21 last year at Syracuse.
- The eight field goals by Hicks are a career high.
- It was Hicks' third career 20-point game and the fifth 20-point career game for Meeks.
- Meeks posted his second double-double of the season and the 14th of his career with 20 points and 10 rebounds.
- Meeks was 7 for 7 from the floor, his best game ever without a miss. He was 6 for 6 from the floor against Davidson in 2013-14.
- Carolina shot a season-high 57.8 percent from the floor.
- Carolina had a season-high rebound margin of plus 29 (52-23).
- This was the third time in five games that UNC grabbed 50 or more rebounds. The 52 tied the season high with the win at Tulane.
- Tony Bradley had a season-high 14 points. He has scored in double figures in all five games.
- Senior Stilman White scored a career-high five points. His previous high was four against Kansas in the NCAA Elite Eight in St. Louis in 2012.
- Freshman Brandon Robinson shared the team lead in assists (with Joel Berry) with four in just 14 minutes. He suffered a cut lip that required him leaving the game in the first half. He received three stitches in the locker room at halftime and returned to play nine minutes in the second half.
- Joel Berry II tied his career high with four steals.
- Nate Britt tied his career high with three steals.
- Kenny Williams had three offensive rebounds and tied his career high with three steals.

Non-Conference Slate One of Nation's Best

- ESPN rated Carolina's non-conference schedule the second-most difficult in the country behind Kansas.
- UNC's non-conference schedule includes five NCAA Tournament teams (Chattanooga, Hawai'i, Indiana, Kentucky and Northern Iowa) and three NIT teams from a year ago (Long Beach State, Davidson and Monmouth).
- Four of UNC's non-conference opponents have been picked to win their respective conferences in preseason media polls (Chattanooga in the Southern Conference, Long Beach State in the Big West, Kentucky in the SEC and Monmouth in the Metro Atlantic).
- Northern Iowa is picked third in the Missouri Valley, Indiana is picked third in the Big 10 and Davidson is picked fourth in the A-10.
- UNC will also play either Wisconsin (highest-rated Big 10 team in the preseason AP poll) or Georgetown (picked fourth in the Big East) on Wednesday in Maui.

Tar Heels Open Hawaiian Trip with W

- Isaiah Hicks led five scorers in double figures, including Tony Bradley, who had his first collegiate double-double, and UNC overcame a poor defensive effort and shaky shooting from some of its top scorers in an 83-68 win at Hawai'i on Friday evening, November 18th.
- The game was played at 1 a.m. Eastern Time.
- Carolina shot 63.3 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half this year.
- That followed a first half in which UNC shot a season-low for any half at 35.1 percent.
- Starting perimeter players Joel Berry II, Justin Jackson and Nate Britt were a combined 1 for 16 from the floor in the first half but UNC led 35-27 at the break.
- Carolina's bench scored 16 of its 28 points in the first half.
- Carolina's bench made 9 of 19 shots from the floor and combined for 28 points for the game. Tony Bradley had 10 points, Seventh Woods had seven, Kenny Williams had six and Brandon Robinson had five.
- Hawai'i shot 55.2 percent from the floor in the second half. Previous high in a half by the opponents was the second half by Long Beach State, which shot 45.7 percent.
- Carolina shot a season-best 73.3 percent from the free throw line (11 for 15).
- The Tar Heels had a season-best rebounding margin of plus-23 (46-23).
- Freshman Tony Bradley scored in double figures for the fourth straight game (most to start a career since Brandan Wright did it in the first 18 games in 2006-07).
- Bradley also grabbed a season-high 13 rebounds, most by a UNC freshman since Kennedy Meeks had 13 against Iowa State in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.
- Nate Britt scored a season-high 13 points on 5 of 9 shooting from the floor and 3 of 5 from three-point range. It was his 16th time in double figures as a Tar Heel and his first since he had 10 against Miami on 2/20/16. It was his highest scoring game since he had 17 against

Davidson on 12/6/15.

- Isaiah Hicks led UNC with 16 points on 7 of 8 shooting from the floor. It matched his season high (also 16 at Tulane).
- Joel Berry II had a season-high six assists but was 1 for 9 from the floor (0 for 5 3FGs). His previous high for attempts without making a three-pointer was four against Syracuse in the 2016 national semifinal.
- Kenny Williams made two three-pointers in a game for the first time as a Tar Heel.

No. 4 in the Polls

- Carolina is ranked No. 4 in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/Coaches polls.
- This is the 41st season since 1955-56 that the Tar Heels have been ranked in the top four in the AP poll at same point in the season.
- Carolina opened the season No. 6 in both polls.
- This is the 11th straight year UNC was ranked in the preseason AP poll (last time not ranked to begin the season was 2005-06) and the 30th time in the last 32 seasons (1984-85 and 2005-06).
- This is the 38th season in which the Tar Heels began the year ranked in the AP top 10. It is the 11th preseason top-10 ranking in Roy Williams' 14 seasons as UNC's head coach. The Tar Heels finished the season in the top 10 in seven of the previous 10 seasons under Williams in which it began in the top 10.

Positional Watch Lists

- Four Tar Heels are on preseason watch lists for top players in the country at their respective positions:
 - Joel Berry II is on the Bob Cousy Award list for point guards
 - Justin Jackson is on the Julius Erving Award list for small forwards
 - Isaiah Hicks is on the Karl Malone Award list for power forwards
 - Kennedy Meeks is on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award list for centers

12 Wins to 800

- Roy Williams has won 788 games. He passed Lefty Driesell with the win at Hawai'i for the ninth-most wins by a Division I coach in college basketball history.
- He is 12 wins shy of becoming the ninth coach to win 800 games as a Division I head coach.
- Williams entered the season with 28.0 wins per season, the most wins per year among coaches who have won at least 700 games. Mike Krzyzewski is second with 25.4 wins per season.
- Williams is sixth all-time and first among active coaches with 20 years experience in winning percentage at .790.

Three Games to 1,000

- Carolina's game vs. Oklahoma State is the 998th as a college head coach for Roy Williams. He will coach his 1,000th college game on November 30th at Indiana.
- Williams will become the 10th active coach with at least 1,000 games.

Carolina's 14 active NBA players are signed to contracts worth just under \$94 million this season.

Those 14 players entered the 2016-17 season with NBA career earnings of \$441 million.

Brice Johnson (injured) will become the 79th former Tar Heel to play in the NBA.

17 Tar Heels have won 32 total NBA championships as players. Michael Jordan won six; Rick Fox, Mitch Kupchak, Scott Williams and James Worthy won three apiece. Jordan was NBA Finals six times and Worthy won in 1988.

Jordan won the NBA's MVP award five times and Bob McAdoo won it once. Five Tar Heels have won NBA Rookie of the Year honors. 13 Tar Heels have made NBA All-Star teams. 7 Tar Heels have had their jersey retired by NBA teams.

Williams: Most NCAA Tourney Wins

- Roy Williams has led the Tar Heels to 36 wins in the last 13 years, more than any other school in the country has won in that time.
- Over the last 15 years, Williams has won 45 NCAA Tournament games, eight more than any other coach has won in that time.

Roy Williams Era Trends

Roy Williams is in his 14th season as Carolina's head coach. Here are a number of stat trends from his tenure at his alma mater.

- 302-36 when leading at the half
- 178-3 when shooting 50 percent from the floor
- 28-49 when shooting under 40 percent
- 178-16 when holding the opponents under 40 percent shooting from the floor
- 308-51 when out-rebounding the opponent

- 227-47 when the opponents have more turnovers
- 243-28 when scoring 80 or more points
- 117-3 when scoring 90 or more points
- 51-1 when scoring 100 or more points
- 323-53 when the opponents score under 80 points

Berry Second at UNC in Free Throw Percentage

- Joel Berry II has the second-best career free throw percentage at .848 (139 for 164).
- Shammond Williams is first at .849.
- Berry shot 86.7 percent from the line last year, the seventh-highest single-season percentage in UNC history.
- Berry shot 91 percent in ACC play and 90 percent in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.
- Berry has not attempted a free throw in the last two games.

- Kennedy Meeks passed the 1,000-point mark in UNC's win over Chattanooga on 11/13/16.
