**Carolina-Wisconsin for Maui Title**

- The Tar Heels have advanced to the championship game with wins over Chaminade (104-61) and Oklahoma State (107-75).
- Fourth-ranked Carolina plays #16/14 Wisconsin in the championship game.
- The Badgers have beaten Tennessee (74-62) and Georgetown (73-57) to reach the final.
- Carolina is playing in its sixth Maui Invitational championship game. The Tar Heels are 3-2 in previous finals.
- Carolina lost in the final in 1989-90 to Missouri and in 1995-96 to Villanova, then won three straight times in the championship game – 1999-2000 over Purdue, 2004-05 over Iowa and 2008-09 over Notre Dame.
- Carolina is 3-0 vs. Big Ten teams in Maui history, including 2-0 in the finals.
- Carolina is just the third team in Maui Invitational history to score 100 points in consecutive games (Oklahoma in 1992-93 and Loyola Marymount in 1990-91).

**UNC in Maui**

- Carolina is 17-3 in seven Maui Invitational appearances. UNC has won three previous titles in 1999-2000, 2004-05 and 2008-09.
- Carolina has won more games (17) in Maui than any school in Maui Invitational history. Duke is second with 15.
- The Lahaina Civic Center is tied for 17th in Carolina history in most wins (17) by the Tar Heels in any arena. Carolina has also won 17 times in the RBC Center in Raleigh, N.C., and

**RANDOM FACT #1**

Juniors Joel Berry II and Justin Jackson have both scored 20 points in two of UNC's first six games this season. They did not do that in their first two collegiate seasons.

**RANDOM FACT #2**

The Tar Heels have shot 50 percent from the floor in each of the last five halves, including all four halves in their first two games in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational in Lahaina.

**RANDOM FACT #3**

Carolina has more offensive rebounds (106) than the opponents have defensive rebounds (105). The Tar Heels are second in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (.503) behind Rutgers. Tony Bradley and Kennedy Meeks are first and third in the country, respectively, in offensive rebounding percentage.

- Freshman Joseph Forte was the MVP in 1999-2000 after scoring 24 points in his college debut in the opener vs. Southern California, adding 17 in the semis vs. Georgetown and a game-high 21 in the championship vs. Purdue.
- Raymond Felton was MVP in 2004-05 after averaging 9.7 points and 10 assists in the three wins. He injured his wrist in the semifinal, but still had 13 points, nine assists and

• Ty Lawson earned MVP honors in 2008-09 after a 22-point, 11-assist double-double in the finals against Notre Dame.

### Roy Williams in Maui

• This is the sixth time Roy Williams has brought a team to the Maui Invitational.  
 • Williams' teams have a 15-2 record and have won three championships in Maui.  
 • Williams is one of three coaches to win the Maui Invitational at least three times (Mike Krzyzewski - 5, Williams - 3, Jim Boeheim - 3).  
 • At Kansas, he led the Jayhawks to the title in 1996-97 with wins over LSU, California and Virginia.  
 • His UNC teams are 10-1 in Maui, winning the title in 2004-05 and 2008-09.

### UNC All-Time in Hawai'i

• The Tar Heels are 33-5 in the state of Hawai'i - 16-2 in Honolulu and 17-3 in Lahaina.

### The Wisconsin Series

• The Tar Heels are 2-1 vs. Wisconsin.  
 • The Badgers won the last meeting two seasons ago. On March 26, 2015, Wisconsin ended UNC's season in Los Angeles in the NCAA West Regional Sweet 16, 79-72.  
 • Carolina led by seven with under 11 minutes to play, but the Badgers took the lead with 6:08 to play and went 8 for 8 from the foul line in the final minute to hang on for the win.  
 • The teams combined for only nine turnovers, which equal the fewest in any Roy Williams-coached game in Carolina history.  
 • UNC had four turnovers, the fewest ever in a Tar Heel NCAA Tournament loss.  
 • Carolina made 8 of 13 from three-point range, a percentage of .615 that was the highest ever in a UNC loss in an NCAA Tournament loss (surpassed in the loss to Villanova last year).  
 • Brice Johnson and Justin Jackson led UNC with 15 points apiece and Marcus Paige had 12.  
 • Sam Dekker and Frank Kaminsky combined for 42 points for the Badgers.  
 • Six current Tar Heels played in that game: Jackson, Kennedy Meeks, Joel Berry II, Isaiah Hicks, Theo Pinson and Nate Britt.  
 • Jackson was 6 for 11 from the floor (3-3 3FGs) and had three assists.  
 • Berry had nine points and three assists.  
 • Carolina beat the Badgers, 60-57, in Chapel Hill on 11/30/11 in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge.  
 • Carolina beat the Badgers, 88-82, in Syracuse, N.Y., on 3/27/05, in the NCAA East Regional Elite Eight, a win that propelled the Tar Heels to the Final Four where they won the 2005 NCAA championship.  
 • Sean May, Carolina's director of player personnel, had 29 points and 12 rebounds, and was the MVP of the regional.  
 • Roy Williams is 2-1 against Wisconsin, all while the head coach at UNC.

### Hot-Shooting, Defense Fuel Win Over Cowboys

• Carolina had season-high shooting percentages from the floor, three-point range and the free throw line and held Oklahoma State 30 points below its season average in a 107-75 win in the Maui semifinals.  
 • The 32-point victory is Carolina's largest in the semifinal round of the Maui Invitational. Previous high by UNC in a Maui semifinal was a 29-point win over Oregon in 2008-09.  
 • UNC made 37 of 64 shots from the floor for the second consecutive game and again shot a season-high 57.8 percent from the floor.  
 • Carolina shot 56.3 percent from the floor in the first half and 59.4 percent in the second half.  
 • Carolina has shot better than 50 percent from the floor in five consecutive halves (second half at Hawai'i, both halves vs. Chaminade and Oklahoma State).  
 • Carolina also shot season-high percentages from three-point range (8 of 17, .471) and the free throw line (25 of 29, .862).  
 • Carolina made a season-high 25 free throws.  
 • Carolina scored a season-high 107 points. It's the most points since UNC scored 108 vs. East Carolina on 12/7/14.  
 • Six Tar Heels scored in double figures (second time this year, also Chattanooga) and one other player had nine points.  
 • Carolina held Oklahoma State to 75 points, 29.8 under the Cowboys' season average coming into the game.  
 • Carolina held the Cowboys to six three-pointers in 22 attempts. OSU averaged 12 made threes entering the game.  
 • Two Tar Heels scored 20 points for the second straight game and it was two different players than against Chaminade. Joel Berry II had 24 and Justin Jackson 22 vs. Oklahoma State. Isaiah Hicks (22) and Kennedy Meeks (20) accomplished that vs. Chaminade.  
 • Berry scored a career-high 24 points. It was the third time in six games he set or tied his career scoring high.  
 • Berry went 6 for 6 from the free throw line (his first free throw attempts in three games). He also had five rebounds, four assists and three steals and went 4 for 6 from three-point range.  
 • Berry went 6 for 6 from the FT line, increasing his career numbers from the stripe to 145 for 170, a percentage of .853 that is the highest in Carolina history. He moved ahead of Shammond Williams (.849).  
 • Jackson had one of his most complete games as a Tar Heel with 22 points, eight rebounds, six assists and no turnovers. Jackson was 7 for 12 from the floor, made a three and went 7 for 7 from the free throw line.  
 • Jackson made a career-high seven free throws (previous six at Miami and vs. Indiana).  
 • Jackson tied his best assist/error ratio of his career. He also had six assists and no turnovers at Pitt as a freshman.  
 • Sophomore Kenny Williams made a career-high three three-point field goals. Last year, Williams was 1 for 13 on 3FGs. This year, he is 8 for 17 and has two games with multiple three-pointers.

- Senior guard Nate Britt had 12 points on 5 of 10 shooting from the floor. He has scored 33 points (11.0 ppg) on the road trip. He is 16 for 30 from the floor since the first game of the season.
- Freshman Tony Bradley had 13 points on 5 for 5 shooting from the floor. He is shooting a team-high 72.2 percent from the floor.

#### Tar Heel Notes

- UNC is 6-0 for the first time since going 13-0 to start the 2008-09 season.
- Carolina has scored 80 or more points in all six games, the first time it has done that to start a season since doing that in the first 12 games in 1993-94.
- UNC has scored 100-plus points in consecutive games for the first time since scoring 100 vs. Elon on 12/29/11 and 102 vs. Monmouth on 1/1/12.
- Carolina is 52-1 under head coach Roy Williams when it scores 100 points.
- Carolina has won 51 consecutive times when scoring 100 or more points.
- This was the first time UNC has scored 100 points in consecutive games in Maui in the same year.
- It was the first time any team has scored 100 points in consecutive games in the Maui Invitational since Oklahoma in 1992 (105 vs. Chaminade and 108 vs. DePaul). Loyola Marymount also accomplished that feat in 1990 although it lost one of the two games.
- Carolina is shooting 52.3 percent from the floor and holding the opponents to 36.8 percent. The Tar Heels have not shot 50 percent from the floor since 1997-98.
- Carolina has shot better than 50 percent from the floor in eight of 12 halves this season and better than 60 percent twice.
- Freshman Tony Bradley is shooting a team-high 72.2 percent from the floor and senior Isaiah Hicks is next at 67.3 percent. Brice Johnson (.511 in 2012-13) is the last freshman to lead UNC in field goal percentage.
- Carolina has more offensive rebounds than the opponents have defensive rebounds. UNC has 106 offensive rebounds and the opponents have 105 defensive rebounds.
- Carolina is one of two teams in the country that have more offensive rebounds than the opponents have defense (Rutgers is first).
- Kennedy Meeks (29) and Tony Bradley (26) have combined for 55 offensive rebounds.
- Bradley is first in the country and Meeks is third in offensive rebounding percentage.
- Sophomore guard Kenny Williams is third with 11 offensive rebounds.
- Two Tar Heels have scored in double figures in every game (Justin Jackson and Tony Bradley).
- Carolina has made 123 free throws and the opponents have attempted 95.
- Tony Bradley leads the team in free throw attempts with 29. No freshman has led the team in free throw attempts since Tyler Hansbrough in 2005-06.
- Carolina is shooting 40.7 percent from three-point range (44 for 108). Last year, UNC set a school record for the lowest three-point

percentage (.327).

- Kenny Williams leads UNC in three-point percentage at .471 (8 for 17). Joel Berry II leads UNC with 14 made threes.
- Ten Tar Heel are averaging double-figures in minutes led by Justin Jackson at 28.8 per game.
- Thirty-three percent of the opponent's baskets have been three-point field goals. UNC has made 21 percent of its field goals from behind the arc.
- The opponents have attempted 40 percent of its shots from three-point range. UNC has attempted 27 percent of its field goals from behind the arc.

#### Tar Heels Rout Chaminade in Maui Opener

- Carolina scored a then-season-high 104 points. It was the most points since UNC scored 106 at Florida State on 1/4/16.
- The win over Chaminade was the first time in four seasons that Isaiah Hicks (22) and Kennedy Meeks (20) each scored 20 points in a game.
- Hicks set a career scoring high with 22. He had 21 as a sophomore at Boston College and 21 last year at Syracuse.
- The eight field goals by Hicks were a career high.
- Meeks posted his second double-double of the season and the 14th of his career with 20 points and 10 rebounds.
- Meeks was 7 for 7 from the floor, his best game ever without a miss. He was 6 for 6 from the floor against Davidson in 2013-14.
- Carolina shot a season-high 57.8 percent from the floor.
- Carolina had a season-high rebound margin of plus 29 (52-23).
- It was the third time in five games that UNC grabbed 50 or more rebounds. The 52 tied the season high with the win at Tulane.
- Tony Bradley had a season-high 14 points.
- Senior Stilman White scored a career-high five points. His previous high was four against Kansas in the NCAA Elite Eight in St. Louis in 2012.
- Freshman Brandon Robinson shared the team lead in assists (with Joel Berry) with four in just 14 minutes. He suffered a cut lip that required him leaving the game in the first half. He received three stitches in the locker room at halftime and returned to play nine minutes in the second half.
- Joel Berry II tied his career high with four steals, Nate Britt tied his career high with three steals, and Kenny Williams had three offensive rebounds and tied his career high with three steals.

#### Non-Conference Slate One of Nation's Best

- ESPN rated Carolina's non-conference schedule the second-most difficult in the country behind Kansas.
- UNC's non-conference schedule includes five NCAA Tournament teams (Chattanooga, Hawai'i, Indiana, Kentucky and Northern Iowa) and three NIT teams from a year ago (Long Beach State, Davidson and Monmouth).
- Four of UNC's non-conference opponents have been picked to win their respective con-

Carolina's 14 active NBA players are signed to contracts worth just under \$94 million this season.

Those 14 players entered the 2016-17 season with NBA career earnings of \$441 million.

Brice Johnson (injured) will become the 79th former Tar Heel to play in the NBA.

17 Tar Heels have won 32 total NBA championships as players. Michael Jordan won six; Rick Fox, Mitch Kupchak, Scott Williams and James Worthy won three apiece. Jordan was NBA Finals six times and Worthy won in 1988.

### Tar Heels Open Hawaiian Trip with a 'W'

- Isaiah Hicks led five scorers in double figures, including Tony Bradley, who had his first collegiate double-double, and UNC overcame a poor defensive effort and shaky shooting from some of its top scorers in an 83-68 win at Hawai'i on Friday evening, November 18th.
- The game was played at 1 a.m. Eastern Time.

- Carolina shot 63.3 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half this year.

- That followed a first half in which UNC shot a season-low for any half at 35.1 percent.

- Starting perimeter players Joel Berry II, Justin Jackson and Nate Britt were a combined 1 for 16 from the floor in the first half but UNC led 35-27 at the break.

- Carolina's bench scored 16 of its 28 points in the first half.

- Carolina's bench made 9 of 19 shots from the floor and combined for 28 points for the game. Tony Bradley had 10 points, Seventh Woods had seven, Kenny Williams had six and Brandon Robinson had five.

- Hawai'i shot 55.2 percent from the floor in the second half. Previous high in a half by the opponents was the second half by Long Beach State, which shot 45.7 percent.

- Tony Bradley grabbed a season-high 13 rebounds, most by a UNC freshman since Kennedy Meeks had 13 against Iowa State in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

- Nate Britt scored a season-high 13 points on 5 of 9 shooting from the floor and 3 of 5 from three-point range. It was his 16th time in double figures as a Tar Heel and his first since he had 10 against Miami on 2/20/16. It was his highest scoring game since he had 17 against Davidson on 12/6/15.

- Isaiah Hicks led UNC with 16 points on 7 of 8 shooting from the floor.
