Tech Opens ACC vs. #9 North Carolina

Georgia Tech begins a gauntlet of top-10 teams to open its Atlantic Coast Conference schedule by hosting No. 9/10 North Carolina at noon Saturday at McCamish Pavilion.

Tech (8-4), in its first season under head coach Josh Pastner, is playing its fifth straight home game since a nine-day hiatus for exams, tuning up for its ACC opener by outlasting North Carolina A&T, 59-52, Wednesday night. The Yellow Jackets are 7-2 at home this season.

One of the nation's top offensive teams at nearly 90 points per game, North Carolina (12-2) comes to Atlanta having won its last two games over Northern Iowa (86-42) and Monmouth (102-74) at home. The 2016 national runner-up Tar Heels rank ninth in the nation in scoring average, third in scoring margin and first in rebound margin.

Saturday's game will be televised regionally on the ACC Network, and will be streamed live online on ACC Network Extra (subject to blackout), available through the WatchESPN app. Radio coverage is provided by Tech's flagship station, 680 the Fan (680 AM/93.7 FM), and is available via satellite radio (Sirius ch. 132, XM ch. 193).

Starting Five

• Georgia Tech begins its Atlantic Coast Conference schedule by facing three teams currently ranked in the top 10 of both the Associated Press and the coaches polls - North Carolina (No. 9 AP/No. 10 coaches), Duke (5/5) and Louisville (6/7). **Tech has never faced three teams ranked in the top 10 of both polls in succession in its history, though it came close once.** The Yellow Jackets began the 1994-95 campaign by facing Maryland (7/11), Duke (11/9) and North Carolina (4/2), with only the Tar Heels ranked in the top 10 of both polls. It is the only other time, however, in which Tech faced three teams in a row ranked in the top 10 of one poll

- Saturday's game is the last of five consecutive home games on Georgia Tech's current homestead. Tech begins ACC play by playing at home three times in the first four games, returning to Atlanta to face Louisville and Clemson after a visit to Duke on Wednesday.

- Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner went 4-4 against ACC teams while he was the head coach at Memphis, but never faced North Carolina. He was 2-0 vs. Miami, 2-2 vs. Louisville, 0-1 vs. Syracuse and 0-1 vs. Virginia.

- Tech and North Carolina played two common opponents in their pre-conference schedules - Tulane and Tennessee. The Yellow Jackets defeated Tulane at home, while the Tar Heels won in New Orleans. Tech lost to Tennessee in Knoxville, while North Carolina defeated the Volunteers at home.

- Ten Yellow Jackets earned a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the fall semester, and Tech's cumulative fall GPA of 2.85 is the highest on record for the team. All four seniors are among the group with 3.0+ GPAs, including Josh Heath, Corey Heyward (fifth-year because of an injury red-shirt in 2012-13), Rand Rowland and Quinton Stephens. Rowland graduated last Saturday, and the other three are scheduled to graduate in May.

Series Notes

- North Carolina has a 67-24 lead in the all-time series between the two teams, and a 53-22 advantage since Tech joined the ACC.

- North Carolina has won the last seven meetings in the series, including an 86-78 win last season in Chapel Hill, dating back to a 78-58 win for the Jackets in Atlanta on Jan. 16, 2011.

- Before that, Tech had won four games in a row for its longest winning streak in the series. Tech is 10-13 against North Carolina dating back to the 2001-02 season.

- The teams have played 39 times in the city of Atlanta, including three at McCamish Pavilion, all North Carolina wins. The teams met only 23 times at Alexander Memorial Coliseum, where the Tar Heels won 12 of 23. Tech won six of the last seven meetings in the Thrillerdome, however, and won six of eight against UNC in the Coliseum under Paul Hewitt.

- Between 1982 and 1996, the Yellow Jackets played eight of their home games with the Tar Heels at the old Omni arena in downtown Atlanta (2-6 record). Counting ACC and SIC Tournament games played in the city, Tech is 14-21 vs. North Carolina in Atlanta.

- Tech is 8-5 in games played away from Chapel Hill since 2000-01, including three ACC Tournament wins. The Jackets are 8-13 against the Tar Heels under Roy Williams, 8-14 against Williams all-time.

- Tech has lost 11 of the last 12 meetings in the Smith Center and is 4-24 all-time in the building. Counting regular-season games in Greensboro, Tech is 5-31 on the road against UNC.

- In ACC Tournament play, the Yellow Jackets have won five of nine meetings, and Tech has won the last three encounters (2004, 2005, 2010). Two of Tech's five tournament wins occurred in championship games, the 1985 final in Atlanta and the 1993 final in Charlotte.

- Tech's greatest success in its series with North Carolina occurred during the middle 1990s when the Jackets won five of seven meetings, including three straight wins over No. 1-ranked Tar Heel teams during the 1993 and 1994 campaigns.

Last Meeting

Marcus Georges-Hunt led Georgia Tech with 25 points, and Adam Smith hit six three-point field goals, but Joel Berry II scored a career-high 19 points and hit the go-ahead 3-pointer with 5:07 left to help No. 7 North Carolina past the Yellow Jackets 86-78 in the Yellow Jackets' ACC opener in Chapel Hill.

Brice Johnson added 15 points and 11 rebounds for the

Tar Heels, who trailed by nine points in the first half and by one with 6 minutes left. Marcus Paige added a key pull-up basket during the Tar Heels' finishing kick of scoring on 11 straight possessions, which ended when they ran out the final seconds.

The Yellow Jackets haven't beaten UNC since January 2011 and haven't won in Chapel Hill since a year before that.

Charles Mitchell had 14 points. Georgia Tech shot 42 percent. The Yellow Jackets opened ACC play on the road for the third straight year. Georges-Hunt made 12 of 15 free throws.

The Tar Heels shot 58 percent after halftime and 51 percent for the game with six players scoring in double figures, the third straight game with at least five. UNC had a 39-29 rebounding advantage.

Smith, a graduate transfer from Virginia Tech, had a huge first half with 14 points and four 3s. His output slowed after half-time with UNC doing a better job chasing him and Georges-Hunt taking the lead offensively.

Last Game - Jackets Down N.C. A&T

Reserve forward Kellen McCormick scored 12 points, all on 3-pointers in the second half, and Tadic Jackson scored 11 of his 12 points after the break to help Georgia Tech rally for a 59-52 homecourt win over North Carolina A&T on Wednesday night.

The Aggies (1-12) have never beaten an ACC team in 29 tries, and lost their 33rd consecutive non-conference road game, yet Georgia Tech led for just 10:36.

If not for the surprising heat from McCormick, a graduate transfer from Western Michigan who'd scored just five points in Tech's first 11 games, the Yellow Jackets (8-4) might be heading into Saturday's ACC opener against No. 9 North Carolina with scorch marks.

Tech missed its first seven shots and 13 of their first 15, only to have to steal the lead late in each half.

Tech made five of its last eight shots in the first half for a 26-23 lead, but North Carolina A&T junior guard Sam Hunt scored 16 of his game-high 20 points in the second half. Davaris McGowens added 14 points and eight rebounds for the Aggies.

Hunt gave A&T a 30-28 lead on a 3-pointer with 15:10 remaining.

The Jackets were in trouble as their deficit grew, and center Ben Lammers - their leading scorer, rebounder and shot blocker - was in foul trouble.

McCormick stayed hot, and Tadic Jackson scored seven points in a 9-0 run that gave Tech a 50-45 lead when he was good on a 3-point play with 2:46 left.

The Aggies cut that lead back to a single point before McCormick's final trey gave the Jackets breathing room with 1:29 to go.

Pastner on Opening ACC Play

"When I got the job and I'm sitting in April watching our first workout, if you asked me would you be 8-4 before you go to conference play... I would have given you a kiss on the cheek if we were going to be 8-4.

"Obviously most people picked us last place for the league play, and some have picked us not even to win a game. We are going to have to get in there and find a way. We've got a tough stretch to open up, but every game in the ACC is a battle, and we're excited for the opportunity. We'll get back and work at it and be ready to go on Saturday."

Trending...

- Georgia Tech has hit 63.4 percent of its free throws in its wins, 73.2 percent in its losses. However, the Jackets have outscored their opponents 17.1-11.1 points per game from the line in their eight wins, and have been outscored 12.0-10.3 per game in four losses.

- Tech has limited its last three opponents to 36.7 percent shooting from the floor, forced an average of 15.2 turnovers and averaged 7.2 steals per game. The Jackets rank

No. 70 in adjusted defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com.

- Tech's win over North Carolina A&T was win No. 50 in McCamish Pavilion. Tech is playing its fifth season in the renovated building.

- Tech started Jackson, Lammers, Moore, Okogie and Stephens for the second straight game. Coach Josh Pastner has used four different starting lineups this season. Three Yellow Jackets - Ben Lammers, Josh Okogie and Quinton Stephens - have started every game this season.

- Despite not scoring its first points against A&T until the 14:23 mark of the first half, Tech led at the half (26-23) for the ninth time in 12 games, and improved to 7-1 when leading at the half.

- Tech's 59 points was its third-lowest total of the season and the lowest in any of its eight wins.

- Tech led for just 10:36 of the 40 minutes against North Carolina A&T, a season low for any of the Jackets' eight wins.

- Tech shot 39.6 percent from the floor, the fifth time this season the Yellow Jackets came up short of 40 percent, but the first time they won the game.

- Tech held North Carolina A&T to 32.1 percent from the floor, the sixth time this season that the Yellow Jackets limited an opponent to under 40 percent. Tech is 5-1 in those games. Only Alcorn State (31.4 percent) shot worse against Tech.

- Tech hit 6-of-15 three-point attempts against North Carolina A&T, and is 11-for-26 in its last two games after going 3-for-21 in the two games before that.

- Tech assisted on 16 of its 19 field goals (84.2 percent), its best ratio in any game this season, and stands at 59.4 percent for the season. The team's goal is 60 percent nightly.

- Tech has taken better care of the basketball over its last two games with 10 turnovers against Wofford and 13 against North Carolina A&T.

- Tech blocked nine shots against North Carolina A&T, the team's most since setting the program record of 16 against Southern in the second game of the season. The Jackets rank third nationally in blocked shots per game (7.2).

- Tech was out-rebounded for the fifth time this season (35-33) against A&T, but is 3-2 in those games this season. The Jackets made good on their nine offensive rebounds to the tune of 12 points.

- Ben Lammers kept alive his streak of scoring in double digits in every game this season (12 points, 6 rebounds), hitting 5-of-7 shots from the floor to improve his season success rate to 60.5 percent, which is third-best in the ACC. He is 14-for-19 in his last two games.

- Kellen McCormick scored a season-high 12 points after having scored just five in Tech's first 11 games this season. All 12 came in the second half on four three-point field goals.

- Tadic Jackson started his second straight game (ninth career), and scored nine points in the final 4:44 to help the Jackets erase their deficit for the final time and pull ahead. Jackson (12 points in the game) has reached double figures seven times in 11 games.

- Quinton Stephens continues to be one of Tech's most effective rebounders, pulling down a team-high nine against North Carolina A&T to improve his season rate to 8.1 per game, ranking seventh in the ACC.

- Josh Heath matched his season high with five assists and has eight in his last two games.

- Sylvester Ogbonda came off the bench to block a career-high three shots in five minutes.

Pastner on Tech's Offense

"The whole thing is shooting, being able to make some threes. I think we move the ball well, it didn't stick, it was a hot potato, we kept the thing moving. We've just got to be able to make shots. In the short term, we're just going to have to make some shots. In the long term, the best way to improve shooting is recruiting and we understand what we need to do to attack that. In the short term here for this year, we've got to make sure

that we find ways to score. We're moving the ball. The ball is being moved, we've just got to make some of those open shots. We have zero margin for error when we're not able to shoot like that."

Tech's Block Party

Ben Lammers, with 45 blocked shots in 12 games (No. 2 in the nation), has not been alone in his ability to defend the rim for Georgia Tech. The Yellow Jackets have swatted away 86 shots, a 7.2 average which leads the ACC and ranks No. 2 in the nation.

Quinton Stephens has blocked 14 shots, freshman Josh Okogie has seven, and five other players have at least two.

It may signal a trend for the Yellow Jackets. Only one of Josh Pastner's Memphis teams ranked lower than 21st nationally in blocked shots in seven years, and two of them ranked fourth (6.4 per game each).

Tech blocked a program-record 16 shots against Southern, swatted nine against Ohio and North Carolina A&T and had eight each against Tennessee Tech and Sam Houston State.

Extended Mileage

Research at ESPN confirms that Georgia Tech is the least experienced team in the nation. You don't need to look much further for evidence of that than the Yellow Jackets' minutes-played column on the stat sheet.

Playing time for these five returning letterwinners has drastically escalated to fill the void created by the loss of five seniors from last year's team.

The Laminator is Everywhere

Ben Lammers has come a long way from being a dependable reserve post player for Georgia Tech, his role last season as a sophomore.

After playing all 36 games last season in relief of seniors Charles Mitchell and Nick Jacobs, the 6-10 junior center has flourished in the Yellow Jackets' four-out, one-in system, stringing together six double-doubles and 12 straight double-digit scoring efforts to start the season.

Lammers is currently the nation's No. 2 shot blocker, averaging 3.75 per game. He also is the ACC's third-leading rebounder (10.0 per game), ranks 17th in the ACC in scoring average (14.9 points per game) and No. 2 in field goal percentage (60.5 pct.).

The player who averaged less than 15 minutes per game last year has averaged 33.9 through Tech's first 12 games, including 42 of a possible 45 minutes at VCU, and 37 or more three times in regulation games. He ranks fourth in the ACC in that category.

Pastner on Lammers - "When I first saw Ben in April, and I've told this to Ben too, when I first got the job and our first workout, I was like man he's got some talent, but he has got a long way to go. To his credit the guy has been absolutely coachable, he's done what we've said, he plays hard, he's just a fine, fine student-athlete and represents Georgia Tech. He's gotten better and better and better. He's gotten more confident and I think he just hasn't even really filled his whole potential. I'm proud of him, he's six double-doubles already, never had one coming into this year."

Action Jackson

When Tadic Jackson is healthy and playing well, he makes a difference for the Georgia Tech with his ability to penetrate, handle the ball and score in traffic. The Josh Pastner system seems to suit his skill set.

The junior from Tifton, Ga., has connected on 49.5 percent of his shots from the floor, and 16-of-31 (51.6 pct.) from three-point range, both well above his career norms of 32.2 percent overall and 21.9 percent from distance.

Jackson can be a game-changer. Responding to a challenge from head coach Josh Pastner after a lackluster 10 minutes at Tennessee, the 6-2 junior scored 16 of his 24 points in the second half at VCU and buried a big three-pointer in overtime. He finished 9-of-18 from the floor, hit a pair of threes and did not turn the ball over in 31 minutes.

Wednesday against North Carolina A&T, he scored 11 of his 12 points in the second half, including seven of the nine straight points Tech scored to erase a 45-41 deficit in the final 4:44.

He made a big splash in the final 10 minutes of the first half in Tech's game against Southern, scoring 13 of his career-high 20 points to fuel a run that took Tech from an 18-16 lead to 41-25 at the half. He finished 8-of-11 from the floor and grabbed five rebounds in 21 minutes.

Pastner on Jackson - "I've been hard on him, but I've been hard on him knowing his upside and his potential. I've pushed him hard, and I've held him accountable, but Tadic is a fine, young man and he's got a chance to be a really good player. He just has to stay aggressive, he's got to stay in attack mentality. His offense has to come through his defense and rebounding. That's where you get your energy. He's got to continue to take great pride in that."

Higher Q

Quinton Stephens has spent three years working to become a more consistent outside shooter, but as a senior in Georgia Tech's new system under head coach Josh Pastner, the 6-9 forward has expanded his game and found other ways to help the Yellow Jackets.

Stephens, playing a stretch-4 position rather than his wing forward of the past, fills up most every column on the stat sheet in a nightly basis. He has doubled his career scoring (10.1 ppg) and rebounding averages (8.1), scoring in double figures eight times and rebounding in double digits four times.

He is also second on the team in assists (2.4 per game) and, in keeping with Pastner's attack-on-offense mandate, has strung to the free throw line more frequently. He is 32-of-48 from the foul line this season, already surpassing his career-best totals from last year (22-of-30).

His game against North Carolina A&T was indicative - on a poor shooting night (2-of-10), he scored nine points by getting to the free throw line (5-of-6), grabbed nine rebounds, had an assist and two blocked shots.

Pastner on Stephens - "Quinton has totally changed his game. You see Quinton on the glass, the way he's flying all over the place. He's doing things he has never done. He has totally changed his game for the better."

Josh 2.0

Freshman Josh Okogie has averaged 13.3 points through his first 12 collegiate games, rivaling the starts of some of the best freshmen in Georgia Tech history.

Okogie ranks 25th in the ACC in scoring average, and was honored as the ACC's Rookie of the Week on Nov. 28 after pouring in a Tech freshman record 38 points against Tulane on Nov. 26.

His 159 points through 12 games are the most for a Yellow Jacket freshman since Thaddeus Young piled up 167 through his first 11 games in 2006-07, and he has eight double-digit efforts.

When he has shot the ball well, Tech has won (50.7 pct.

He's gotten to the free throw line a team-high 68 times (75 percent), mostly due to his ability to attack the basket and run the floor in transition. He ranks fifth in the ACC in free throw attempts per game.

The Snellville, Ga., freshman has also proven to be Tech's best rebounding guard, grabbing 3.9 per game to rank third on the team. He took 11 against Ohio and eight against Georgia.

Pastner on Okogie - "Josh Okogie is going to keep getting better and better and better. He's barely tapped his potential. He's got to continue being sound and continue to improve. His future is extremely, extremely bright."

Okogie Goes for 38 vs. Tulane

Josh Okogie set a Georgia Tech freshman record for points in a game with his 38 on Nov. 26 against Tulane. He hit 12 of 20 shots from the floor and 13 of 18 from the free throw line (more than Tulane's entire team, 12-of-17). It is the most points scored by an ACC player in a game this season.

- He eclipsed the previous Tech freshman mark of 33 by Mark Price against Virginia on March 12, 1983 (ACC Tournament) and Dion Glover against Seton Hall on March 11, 1998 (NIT).
- It was the fourth-most points scored by a freshman in ACC history and the most since the 2013 ACC Tournament, when Boston College's Olivier Hanlan scored 41 (the ACC freshman record) against Georgia Tech. There have been two other 40-point games by freshmen in ACC history - Harrison Barnes of North Carolina in 2011 and Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina in 2006.
- Okogie's 38 points were the most by any Tech player since Kenny Anderson scored 42 vs. Howard on Jan. 2, 1991, and tied for the seventh-highest single-game scoring total in program history.
- Okogie became the fifth different Tech freshman to score 30 points in a game (Kenny Anderson did it four times, Mark Price did it twice, Dion Glover and Thaddeus Young did it once each).
- Okogie scored 14 straight points for Tech bridging intermission, including the last six points of the first half and the first eight of the second half. His spree helped Tech extend its lead from 31-30 to 45-32.

Pastner on Okogie's 38-point night - "He didn't take plays off. Beforehand, he was having the tendency to take plays off. Now I say that, you look at his numbers as a freshman has been pretty darn good. He's just going to continue to get better. The reason he scored offensively was because he was at his best defensively as he's been all year long. It translated to him being really locked in defensively. When he is not locked in defensively, he is not as effective offensively. Tonight he was his best defensively and it triggered and translated into him being great offensively."

New Era Beginning for Tech Basketball

Georgia Tech begins its 102nd season of basketball in 2016-17 under new head coach Josh Pastner, the 14th head coach in program history.

Pastner, 39, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He is tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 20 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 490 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 18 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

Jackets At-A-Glance

The Yellow Jackets return seven letterwinners from a team that won 21 games and advanced to the third round of the National Invitation Tournament last spring, including senior forward Quinton Stephens (6-9, Atlanta, Ga.), senior guards Josh Heath (6-2, Tampa, Fla.) and Corey Heyward (6-1, Duluth, Ga.) and junior guard Tadic Jackson (6-2, Tifton, Ga.), who have started 76 games between them in their careers, and junior center Ben Lammers (6-10, San Antonio, Texas).

Tech lost its top four players in scoring, starts and minutes played from a year ago, including Marcus Georges-Hunt, now in the NBA D-League after averaging 16.7 points per game last year, and Adam Smith, a 41-percent three-point shooter now playing in Europe.

But Pastner's first Tech team has some veteran presence. Stephens, who started the last 11 games of the 2015-16 season, had 26 career starts in the last three years and had missed only one game in his career. Heath started 21 games last season and had 29 starts overall in his career. Heyward started 15 games as a freshman and has 18 career starts. Jackson had seven career starts and missed only one game in two seasons. Graduate transfers Kellen McCormick (Western Michigan) and Jodan Price (Eastern Michigan) had 12 starts and 166 games played between them.

Stephens was Tech's top returning scorer at 5.0 points per game, while Jackson was sixth on the scoring chart at 4.7 points per game.

Tech does not have the size it enjoyed with post-players Charles Mitchell and Nick Jacobs last year, and none of Tech's returning frontcourt players had started a game in college. But Lammers played in all 36 games last season, averaging 14.5 minutes per game and leading the team in blocked shots (47). That group includes 6-9 sophomore Abdoulaye Gueye (Dakar, Senegal) and 6-10 freshman Sylvester Ogbonda (Port Harcourt, Nigeria), both of whom redshirted last season.

Tech Adds Solid Freshman Class

Tech's freshman class includes a trio of three-star perimeter players in 6-5 Christian Matthews from Clinton, Md., 6-4 Justin Moore from San Diego, Calif., and 6-4 Josh Okogie from Snellville, Ga. Matthews, a high-scoring wing from National Christian Academy, and Okogie, a first-team all-state choice from Shiloh High School, signed in the early period last November, while Moore, an all-state point guard in California, came on board in June after initially signing with Tulane.

Two Grad Transfers Complete Roster

Kellen McCormick, a sharp-shooting forward from Western Michigan, and Jordan Price, a solid wing from Eastern Michigan, enrolled at Georgia Tech during the summer term to give the Yellow Jackets additional veteran presence on the roster. McCormick, the son of former Michigan center and current ESPN basketball analyst Tim McCormick, made 42 percent of his three-point tries over three seasons at Western Michigan. Price, from Indianapolis, Ind., initially enrolled at DePaul and played two years at Eastern Michigan (28 percent on his threes) before landing at Tech.

Transition Points

According to ESPN.com's John Gasaway, Tech is the least experienced team in Division I, returning only 25 percent of its possession-minutes from 2015-16. Gasaway measures experience by calculating a team's "returning possession minutes," the percentage of minutes that a player recorded last season, multiplied by the percentage of the team's possessions that he used (as listed at kenpom.com).

Georgia Tech is playing a program-record 31 regular-season games this season, assisted by participating in an exempt four-game, multi-team event to begin the season. Tech also filled its bye spot in the ACC schedule on Feb. 7 with Tusculum.

Tech also is playing a program-record 19 regular-season home games in 2016-17, nine in the ACC and 10 non-conference. The previous high was 18 last season.

Georgia Tech lost 78 percent of its scoring and 67 percent of its minutes from last year's team, which went 21-15 and reached the quarterfinals of the National Invitation Tournament.

Georgia Tech's roster includes 12 scholarship players and three walk-ons. Of the 12 scholarship players, five are seniors.

Only one member of Tech's starting lineup that was used over the final 11 games of the 2015-16 season is back, but Pastner has two returning players who made more than 10 starts last season - Quinton Stephens (14) and Josh Heath (11).

Career collegiate starts by current players before this season - Corey Heyward (18), Tadic Jackson (7), Kellen McCormick (2), Jordan Price (10), Quinton Stephens (26).

Sophomore forward Abdoulaye Gueye and freshman center Sylvester Ogbonda sat out the season as redshirts.

Tech's top four scorers from a year ago, all seniors, accounted for 71.4 percent of the Yellow Jackets' points, 68.7 percent of the shots taken and 55.2 percent of the minutes.

Pastner's Winning Staff

Head coach Josh Pastner and all three assistant coaches played major conference Division I basketball - Eric Reveno at Stanford (1985-89), Tavaras Hardy at Northwestern (1998-2002), Darryl LaBarrie at Georgia Tech and Pastner at Arizona (1993-97).

Tech's coaching staff has participated in 32 NCAA Tournaments collectively - Reveno has been involved in eight NCAA Tournaments as a coach and one as a player; Hardy in three as a coach; LaBarrie in two as a coach and one as a player; and Pastner in 13 as a coach and four as a player.

Pastner hired two former Georgia Tech players to his staff - assistant coach LaBarrie, who played three years under Bobby Cremins and Paul Hewitt (1998-2001) and was an assistant coach for two years under Hewitt (2009-11), and director of player personnel Mario West, a non-scholarship player under Hewitt (2003-07) who played two seasons in the NBA.

Only two members of Pastner's staff at Memphis, director of operations Julian Swartz and video coordinator Tyler Benson, followed him to Georgia Tech. All three assistant coaches are new to Pastner's staff.

Pastner on How Tech Should Play

Jackets Sign NY Guard Alvarado

Successfully recruiting the New York area for the first time since the late 1990s, Georgia Tech signed Brooklyn, N.Y., point guard Jose Alvarado during the November signing period.

The reigning New York City Catholic League player of the year, the 6-foot point guard led Christ the King High School in Middle Village, N.Y., the No. 19 team in the nation entering the 2016-17 season, to the New York City title twice and his AAU team, the New York Rens, to the Peach Jam quarterfinals last summer. He follows a pair of legendary New York point guards into the Tech program - Kenny Anderson (1989-91) and Stephon Marbury (1995-96).

Alvarado, a three-star prospect described as a tough, gritty, pass-first point guard, is ranked the No. 9 player in the state of New York and No. 33 in the nation at his position by ESPN. He averaged 17 points and 6.5 assists per game as a junior for Christ the King, which fell in the Catholic League semifinals last season, and 11 points and five assists in his first season with the Rens.

Tech to Open 2017-18 Season in China

Georgia Tech has been invited to play UCLA in the 2017 Pac-12 China Game presented by the Alibaba Group, the Pac-12 Conference announced Friday. Longtime Pac-12 partner Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC), which operates under China's Ministry of Education, will serve as the co-host for the game.

The announcement came in the lead-up to the 2016 Pac-12 China Game, in which Stanford will take on Harvard this Saturday at the Mercedes-Benz Arena in Shanghai. That game will be televised live in the United States on ESPN2 at 8 p.m. PT/ 11 p.m. ET on Friday.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech there, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

The 2017 Pac-12 China Game between UCLA and Georgia Tech will tip off the 2017-18 basketball season with specific U.S. and China broadcast information to be finalized at a later date. The game is part of Pac-12 Global, an unprecedented effort to promote goodwill for the Conference and its member institutions through sport, and to provide student-athletes with a transformative cultural exchange experience.

The UCLA game in China will be the second time in program history that Georgia Tech will travel to East Asia for a regular-season men's basketball game. The Yellow Jackets played Boston College and SMU in the 1986 Suntory Ball event in Tokyo, Japan, winning both games.

Other regular-season trips outside the 50 states for Tech in its basketball history include the 1997 Puerto Rico Shootout (Bayamon, P.R.), the 2007 Paradise Jam (St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands) and the 2010 Puerto Rico Tip-Off (San Juan, P.R.). Tech also played four regular-season games in Cuba during the 1925-26 season.

Tech and UCLA will be meeting for the fifth time. The Bruins have won three of the previous four contests, most recently in the championship game of the 2006 Maui Invitational.

Looking Back at 2015-16

Georgia Tech, seeded fourth in the National Invitation Tournament, saw its 2015-16 season come to an end with a 72-56 loss to No. 2 seed San Diego State in the quarterfinals of the National Invitation Tournament at Viejas Arena in San Diego, Calif. The 2015-16 season ended with Tech's 24th post-season appearance in Georgia Tech's basketball history, and the eighth appearance for the Yellow Jackets in the NIT.

The Yellow Jackets compiled a 21-15 overall record, the most wins by a Tech team since the 2009-10 season, and went 8-10 in the ACC, only the 15th team to win as many conference games in the program's 37-year history in the league. Only two Tech teams have won more games overall since 1996.

The Jackets went to San Diego having won eight of their last 10 games, including an 81-62 victory over Houston opening round of the NIT and an 83-66 win on the road over No. 1 seed South Carolina in the second round. Over its last six regular season games, Tech defeated Florida State, No. 19 Notre Dame, Clemson, Boston College and Pittsburgh, and lost only to No. 11 Louisville (on the road by three). The Jackets then defeated Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament before falling to fourth-ranked Virginia.

Along the way, Tech defeated five teams that made the NCAA Tournament - Green Bay, Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, VCU and Virginia, and defeated two top-10 teams in Notre Dame and Virginia. Among Tech's 15 losses were 10 to teams that made the NCAA Tournament and Louisville, which would have made the field if not for a self-imposed ban.

• **Free basketball** - Georgia Tech played in the post-season for the first time since 2010, when the Yellow Jackets last played in the NCAA Tournament. Tech played in the NIT for

the first time since 2003, and advanced to the quarterfinals for the fourth time.

• **Twenty-something** - The Yellow Jackets earned their first 20-win season since 2009-10, and their fourth in the last 20 years. Tech has won 20 games in a season 15 times in its history. Only two Tech teams have won more games since 1996 - the 2004 Final Four team (28) and the 2010 NCAA second-round team (23).

• **Tough at home** - Tech finished the season 14-5 at home, percentage-wise its best home record, and its most home wins, in five seasons under Brian Gregory. The Jackets, who closed out the home schedule with five straight wins, had not posted a better home record since going 14-2 in 2009-10.

• **On the road** - Tech was 5-8 in road games last season, winning at Tulane, NC State, Florida State, Boston College and South Carolina. The Jackets last won five road games in the 2013-14 season, and last won six road games in the 2007-08 season.

• **Experienced** - According to KenPom.com, Tech had the ninth most experienced roster in the nation, with an average number of years experience at 2.37. Tech had five seniors (one a fifth-year), three juniors (one in his fourth year in the program) and four sophomores (one in his third year).

• **Historical reference** - In Tech's 37 years in the ACC, 15 Yellow Jacket teams have won eight or more ACC games in the regular season. Only four have won nine or more.

Four Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA rosters when the season began.

Iman Shumpert, a five-year NBA veteran, begins his second full season in Cleveland after helping the Cavaliers win the NBA championship a year ago.

Thaddeus Young, in his 10th season, was traded to the Indiana Pacers during the off-season after two years in Brooklyn.

Derrick Favors has emerged as a key figure in his sixth season in Utah.

Anthony Morrow, a nine-year NBA veteran after catching on with Golden State as a free agent in 2009, is now in his third season in Oklahoma City.

Jarrett Jack, a 12-year NBA veteran who suffered a knee injury last January while with Brooklyn, was signed by the Atlanta Hawks during the off-season but then was cut by the team in the last week of training camp while continuing his recovery.

Chris Bosh, who spent the first seven years of his NBA career in Toronto, played his sixth season in Miami but saw his season cut short by a heart condition for the second year in a row. He remains under contract to the Heat but has not played.

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are generally closed to the public and the media, but coaches and players are available during the half-hour prior to practices most non-game days. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations are allowed to shoot B-roll during the first 15 minutes of those practices.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific player requests.

Interview requests with players that need to be conducted at other times must be made through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the players' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact players directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make players available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Media wishing to speak with Coach Pastner either before a practice or at other times must notify Mike Stamus in the communications office in advance to make or confirm arrangements. He also is available each Monday on the ACC Teleconference (10:40 a.m.) beginning January 9.

Post-Game Protocol

Both head coaches will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Players requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. live on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning Dec. 5.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2016-17 season, beginning on Monday, January 9, 2017, and continuing through February 27. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Georgia Tech head coach Josh Pastner will be on the teleconference at 10:40 a.m. each week.

Coaches that play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will adjust somewhat for the head coaches whose teams do not play that Monday night.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated.

Derek Craig and Nick Foreman received their Tech degrees in 2012, as did the 2013 senior class of Mfon Udofia, who finished his business administration degree work in the summer, and Pierre Jordan, who completed his Masters degree requirements in building construction in the spring. Brandon Reed graduated in the summer with his management degree before transferring back to Arkansas State to play his final year of basketball.

All three of Tech's four-year seniors in 2013-14 - Kammeon Holsey, Daniel Miller and Jason Morris - graduated that spring. Robert Sampson, the Jackets' only undergraduate scholarship senior in 2014-15, graduated in the spring.

From the 2015-16 squad, Marcus Georges-Hunt walked the stage at commencement in May, accomplishing the rare feat of graduating in four years. Point guard Travis Jorgenson, who elected not to use his final year of eligibility, will receive his degree in December.

This year's roster includes seniors Josh Heath, Corey Heyward (fifth-year because of an injury red-shirt in 2012-13), Rand Rowland and Quinton Stephens. Rowland graduate in December, and the other three are scheduled to graduate in May.

Georges-Hunt and current junior Tadic Jackson have made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recored the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last four years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech has played four seasons in McCamish Pavilion, which was for all intents and purposes, brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which was re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most striking features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse nearly all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

ACC Schedule Rotation Set

Every other team in the Atlantic Coast Conference will visit McCamish Pavilion at least once in the next two seasons. Clemson and Notre Dame, Tech's permanent home-and-away partners, as well as NC State and Syracuse, will come to Atlanta during both seasons.

Tech's home schedule for this season (2016-17) also includes Boston College, Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina and Pittsburgh. In the 2017-18 season, Duke, Miami, Virginia,

Virginia Tech and Wake Forest come to Atlanta.

Along with the Tigers and the Fighting Irish, the Yellow Jackets play NC State and Syracuse home and away this season and will face Virginia and Wake Forest twice in 2017-18.

The matchups designate the 18-game home and away opponents for each of the next two seasons. Regular-season ACC matchups for the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons are listed below.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech played in the NCAA Tournament five times in 11 seasons under head coach Paul Hewitt and has played in the event 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were the Yellow Jackets' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Tech's NIT History

Georgia Tech has a 10-8 record all-time in eight appearances in the National Invitation Tournament, reaching the finals once (1971) and the quarterfinals four other times. The Yellow Jackets are 4-1 in post-season NIT games played at home, 1-5 on the road.

- Tech's last appearance in the NIT before this season occurred in 2003, when current NBA stars Chris Bosh and Jarrett Jack were freshmen on a team that also included B.J. Elder, Tech's 12th all-time leading scorer and Marvin Lewis, No. 21 on the all-time scoring list. That team defeated Ohio State at home and Iowa on the road before falling a game short of going to New York in an 80-72 loss to a Bob Knight-coached Texas Tech team.

- Tech also made the quarterfinals in 1998 with a team led by No. 2 all-time leading scorer Matt Harpring, defeating Seton Hall and Georgetown before losing to Penn State, 75-70. All three games were played at home.

- Tech reached the finals in 1971 behind its all-time leading scorer, Rich Yunkus, defeating LaSalle, Michigan and St. Bonaventure before losing to North Carolina in the championship game. The entire tournament was played at Madison Square Garden in those days.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 37 ACC Tournaments, and has a 26-34 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010) and 2-5 under Brian Gregory.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner

Josh Pastner, who guided Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, was introduced as Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016.

Pastner, 39, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He is tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and is the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 20 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 490 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 18 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. He became one of three head coaches in Tigers history to earn postseason berths in five of his first seven seasons (Larry Finch, John Calipari are the others), one of two to lead the program to four NCAA Tournaments in his first seven seasons (Dana Kirk is the other) and one of three head coaches in program history to lead the Tigers to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2011-14; joins Dana Kirk 1982-85, John Calipari 2006-09).

Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media. Known as a tireless recruiter, he was named the country's No. 7 high-major recruiter by FoxSports.com following the 2007-08 season, and has signed five straight nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including the nation's No. 1 class in 2010 and No. 2 class in 2013.

A native of Kingwood, Texas, Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball for the Wildcats under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.

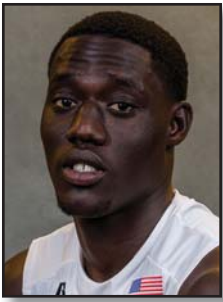

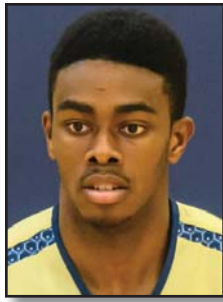
